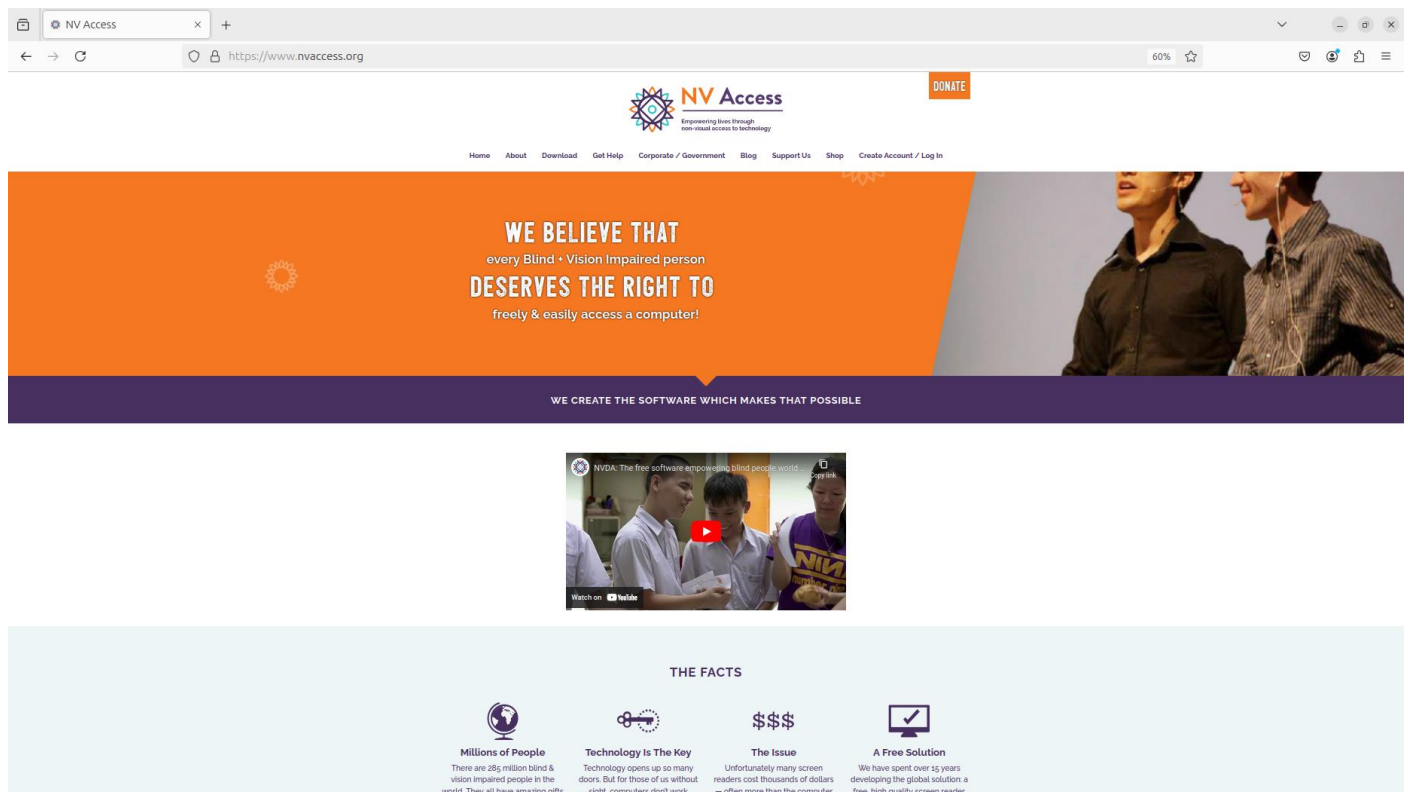


Fig. 1: The NVDA software Homepage



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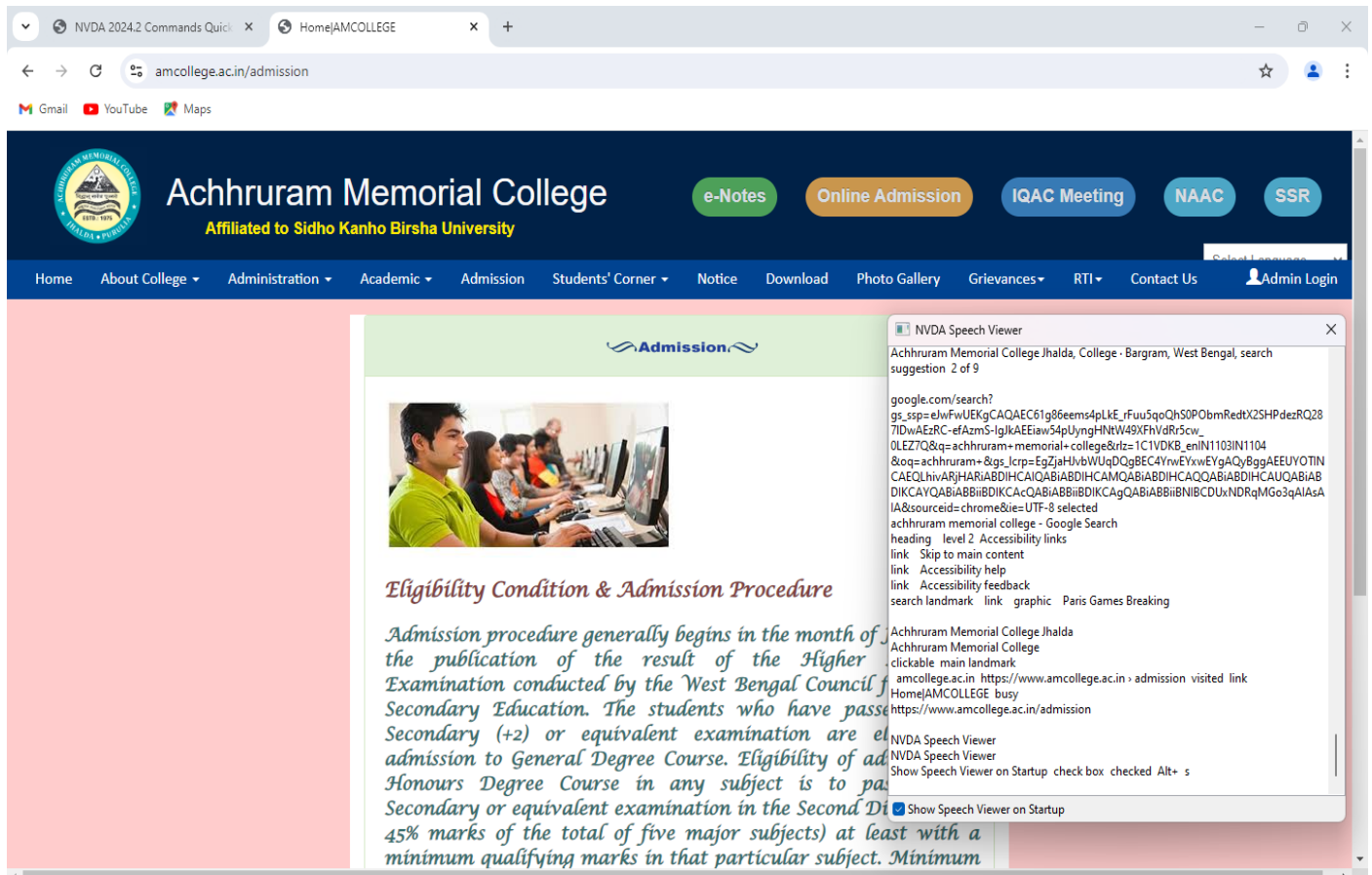


Fig. 2: NVDA Software Installed College Computers Browsing the College website

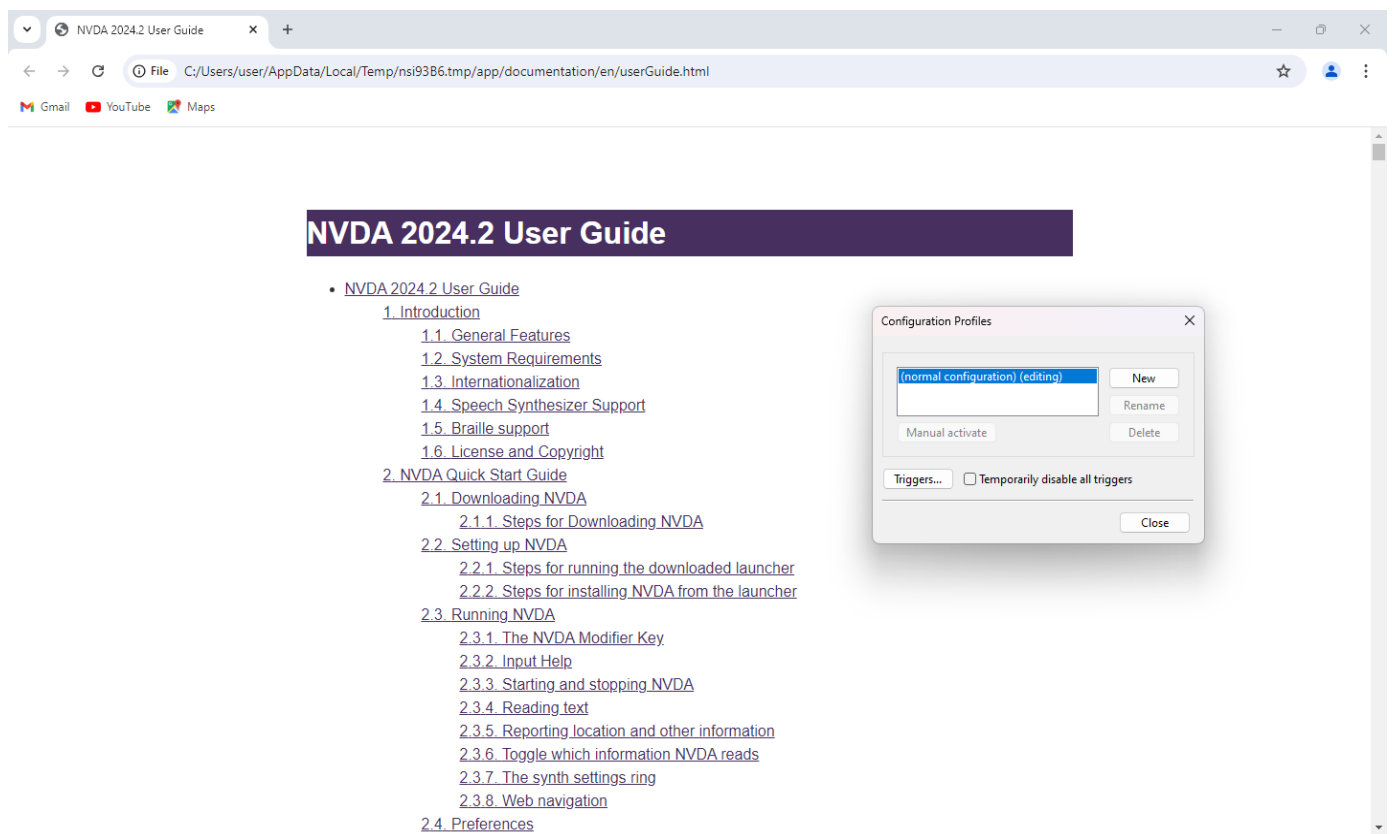


Fig. 3: NVDA Software functioning in a Computer in College


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
